by these Presents that on this the tenth day of Decembar 1783 before me John Valden Dutch Notary Public sworn and admitted by the Court of Holland residing in Amsterdam and in the presence of the witnesses hereafter named personally appeared Mr. Isaac Pardo of this City of Amsterdam Merchant (well known to me the said Notary being blind but of sound mind and memory who considering the frailty of Man's life and having certain Goods Chattels and Credits in England did declare to have made ordained constituted and appointed as his sole and last will and testament in and to the said Isaac Pardo, Moses Pardo, Aaron Pardo and Saul Pardo or the Survivors or Survivor of them to be Executors or Executor of this his present last Will for immediately after the decease of him the said Appraiser to appear before the Right Worshipful the Judge of the prerogative Court of Canterbury or his lawful Surrogate or any other Competent Judge in this behalf and to pray and procure Letters of Administration (with this Will annexed) of all the Goods Chattels and Credits of him the said Appraiser standing at his decease in England in his own name separately or jointly with any other person or persons with power to the said Executors or the Survivors or Survivor of them to substitute one or more Attorneys in their or his stead and part and agree at their or his pleasure to revoke the same All which he the said Appraiser did declare to be his last Will and in witness whereof he hath hereunto set his hand and seal in Amsterdam aforesaid in the presence of the subscribed Witnesses I. This Will was proved at London the thirteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty five before the Right Worshipful John Calvert Doctor of Laws Master of the Bench or Commissioner of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of Saul Pardo one of the Executors named in the said Will of the Decreed limited to his effects in England to whom Administration was granted for the purpose aforesaid but no further or otherwise having been first sworn by Commission duly to administer power reserved of making the like grant to

Mordetlay Pardo, Morda Pardo and Aaron Pardo the other
Executors who they or either of them shall apply for the same

This is the last Will and Testament of me Eliza Potts of
Wotton Garden London In the first place I desire all
my just Debts to be fully paid and in the next place that I
may be buried in a private manner with a grave and two
and one half and two and a half and as to what I may be possessor of at
the time of my Death I desire that as follows first I give
and desire to Mr. Lindley Wife of Thomas Lindley Wotton
anaker of Cold Bath fields or her heirs the sum of one hundred
pounds to be paid out of what I may have to leave at that time
in the four per cents and I give to my half Brother William
Borner Barber in Peter Gate York the sum of one hundred
pounds to be paid out of the aforesaid four per cent stock I desire
to have them all full hundreds and as to what may be coming
to me from my Dear Husbando Effects is got in (which are at
present outstanding to the amount of a thousand pound in
which I fear will be great loss) with what else I am possessor of
as to Close furniture &c. I desire may be equally divided
amongst the Children of my Sister newly and Sister Barbara
the set of silver Caskets and stand with the three mugs to go
to my Sister Ann newly and my Dear Husbando Gold in
Waltham Chain and two seals to my Nephew Mark newly as
left in my Dear Husbando Will, and I desire that they may
have equal shares in the other things my six best prints.
I give and desire to my Good and worthy friend Wm Gibson
Esq. of Newmarket upon this who I hope will be so kind as to
assist my Relations in getting in what is owing as Mr. Richard
Whitons Bond is in hand and he likewise knows of every
thing else that is owing and I so hereby appoint my said
Brother William Borner Executor of this my last Will and
Testament unto which I have set my hand and seal this the ninth
day of March in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and seventy two Elizabeth Potts

If my Brother Borner should die before me then I
appoint my Nephew Mark newly my Executor and what
I had left my Brother should have equally divided amongst
the rest only I desire Mark newly may have twenty
pounds out of it for the trouble he will have in the affair
and I would have him come in for his share with
the rest besides I am very ill at the time of Writing
this but hope but hope it will be understood Eliza Potts

therefore
