MEXICO CITY, July 27.—Many prominent American and Mexican families were brought together at the wedding in Mexico City today of Señorita Carlota Moran y Mariscal of Mexico City and Clarence A. De Lima of New York and Mexico City. It was one of the most brilliant social events in recent years in Mexico. The bride is the daughter of the late Thomas Moran and granddaughter of the late Don Ignacio Mariscal, one time Mexican Ambassador to the United States and for thirty-five years Foreign Minister of Mexico. The bridegroom is a son of a former New York banker, Elias S. A. De Lima, served in the Marine Corps during the war, was wounded three times and received the Croix de Guerre for bravery at Chateau Thierry.
