 declared by the abovenamed Thomas Staples the Testator
 as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of
 us who at his request in his presence and in the presence
 of care of the said Deceased our Names as Witnesses Thomas
 Butcher senior, Thomas Butcher junior, Richard Lead, Twelfth
 day of November 1702.

This Will was proved at London the
 fourth day of January in the year of our Lord one
 Thousand seven hundred and eighty four before the
 Reverend George Harris Esq. of Laws and
 of the Right Worshipful Peter Calvert Esq. of Laws a
 Justice of Peace or Commissioner of the Prerogative Court
 of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of the said
 Executors named in the said Will to whom Administration
 was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and
 Credits of the said Deceased having been first sworn duly to
 administer Power reserved of making the like Grant to
 Thomas Piper Mary Drowne (Wife of Deceased William Drowne)
 and William Drowne the other Executors named in the
 said Will upon their or either of them shall apply for
 the same.

Translation from the New Dutch

On this the 12th April A. 1702
 appeared before us Doan van den Driest Notary Public
 sworn and admitted by the Court of Holland residing in the
 Amsterdam and in the presence of the above named Pudak
 van Benjamin senior dwelling within this City in
 the Herestraat near to the West port Street at the charge
 of Mr. Johannes de Bate being duly but of good understanding
 and able for making a will who did declare to be resolved
 notwithstanding the uncertain time and hour of death to dispose
 of the Goods he shall leave behind and therefore to make
 his Will in the following manner before said the Testator

 above Isaacs a like sum of one hundred Guilders out
 to Alises Senars above also a sum of one hundred
 Guilders out to Isaac Thuidam a like sum of one hundred
 Guilders out to Ester Senior widow of Isaac Fort a like
 sum of one hundred Guilders out to that of the children
 of the beforenamed Abraham Sobart and his late wife Digna
 Isaac Senior that still are a like sum of
 two hundred and fifty Guilders out and to Abraham van
 David Bouriques a sum of fifty Guilders out and the
 Testator doth hereby nominate and institute to be his sole and
 universal heirs under deduction of the above mentioned tax
 legacies and that further might be made by him Testator
 that of the children of his late Cousin Nicodemus Senars
 above that now this day are a like every one of them for
 a like share and by the proceeds of one or more of them
 their lawful heirs or children by representation in all the
 Goods Credits and Debts the Testator shall leave bound
 for to do hereunto and to dispose thereof according to their
 pleasure further the Testator doth hereby desire and appoint
 to be Executor of this his last will director of his house
 and to bear his estate as also to be Administrator of the
 Goods of the undernamed his dear friend Mr. Moses Graal
 Ricardo of this City Merchant giving and granting to him a
 full power and authority as shall be required as
 also that of assumption and intervention to the end of the
 said Commission and with all with respectful conclusion of the
 August 1709 the the Deputie Masters and Administrators
 of this City and all other Grants lately the Testator did hold
 in him the Power and Authority to alter at all times his
 the disposition hereafter by his own writing or by that of
 any other Person should be him Testator; desiring it shall be
 of the same force and value as if it was written and
 subscribed: passed before a Notary and Witnesses all which the
 the said appears did declare to be his last will and Testament
 desiring it may be performed as will or as a Court or in
 such manner it best may subsist Thus passed in Amsterdam
 in the presence of the undernamed Witnesses and Notary
 and Antiquary Mathias van der Meer was signed and
 subscribed by the Testator Isaac Thuidam a Merchant and
 the Notary.
